





Each day Catholic Charities West Michigan works to feed the hungry, counsel those who struggle and build strong families throughout West Michigan. God's Kitchen, a program of Catholic Charities West Michigan, has been a beacon of hope and respite in the Heartside community for over fifty years.

Last year, God's Kitchen served over 75,000 meals. In an effort to eliminate barriers and uplift those in need, each day a noontime meal is provided with no questions asked and no qualifiers. Our mission at God's Kitchen is to directly support those who need immediate help, whoever they may be. We serve the able and disabled, the youngest among us and the elderly, mothers, fathers and those seeking food for their minor children.

In addition to the services provided to our community at God's Kitchen, our reach extends to those in need of support outside of our immediate area through programs such as God's Roamin' Kitchen and Home Delivered Meals. We recognize that the most vulnerable in our communities are often further marginalized by lack of adequate, reliable transportation. God's Kitchen has responded to this barrier through mobile distribution programs which deliver meals directly to individuals who face transportation restrictions.

God's Kitchen opens its doors Monday through Saturday from 12:30PM to 2:00PM and provides a hot, healthy meal to those in need. Meals are prepared by our God's Kitchen staff and our dedicated volunteer community.

Our patrons are served with dignity and respect, with no questions asked and no qualifiers.

God's Roamin' Kitchen

Combatting the barriers that amplify food insecurity is critical to addressing the needs of the hungry in our communities. God's Roamin' Kitchen is an extension of God's Kitchen and operates as a mobile food distribution service in rural areas where transportation is limited and critical resources are inaccessible.

God's Roamin' Kitchen distributes 100 hot, healthy meals in rural areas on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 11:30 to 12:30PM.

- God's Roamin' Kitchen was established in 2019.
- God's Roamin' Kitchen served over 11,000 healthy meals in underserved communities last year.
- God's Roamin' Kitchen is a gateway for additional outreach, connecting families with CCWM and area partner services.

Hunger in rural Michigan

- In counties with the highest population of food insecure children, 84% are rural.
- **Nine** out of **ten** counties with the highest food insecurity rates are rural.
- 1 in 4 adults experience transportation insecurity.

Home delivered meals

The Home Delivered Meal program at God's Kitchen provides those who are homebound with a supply of fresh, healthy meals. Each week, our dedicated delivery volunteers visit those who can't access services at God's Kitchen, ensuring these individuals are not excluded from our community.

Volunteers deliver one week's worth of meals to homebound individuals throughout the greater Grand Rapids area.

The impact of immobility

- **One in four** adults in Michigan struggle with a disability.
- Adults with mobility restrictions are more likely to suffer from the mental impacts of immobility such as depression.
- Individuals with a disability have an increased risk of suffering from health issues related to food access such as diabetes and heart disease.

- The God's Kitchen home delivered meal program delivers over 10,000 meals to those who are homebound.
- Individuals receiving home delivered meal support have been referred to our program and face a range of medical complications that restrict mobility.
